Time - reading digital and analogue time, reading the 24hr clock and time intervals.

Length - Convert between different units of weight and length, and estimate, compare and calculate.

Fractions - adding, multiplying, dividing and subtracting. Fractions of unknown amounts

Creative Curriculum:

Science: In Science we will be studying Animals, including Humans. We will look at the circulatory system and how it impacts upon healthy living. We will also look at how living things are classified.

History and Geography: We are looking at the causes and impact of the Second World War. We will discuss how it would have been like as an evacuated child during the Blitz. We will also look at trade across Europe and Russia and how goods and resources travel across borders.

RE: We are identifying the key aspects of Judaism and comparing it to our own beliefs.

PHSE: This term we will focus on understanding what Privacy and how we respect the privacy of others.

During Black History Month in October, we will learn about the contributions of significant individuals, in particular Harriet Tubman

Computing: This term's focus is developing our understanding how to research and present information using different digital media

Art/DT: We will be learning about form and sculpture and how to embellish different artistic forms
